SeaSeal is our dedicated land-based, Atlantic grey seal photo-ID project. The aim of the project is to create a catalogue of individual grey seals in Cardigan Bay and to discover more about their travelling habits and areas that are important to them.

We are looking for a volunteer to continue the SeaSeal project from **25th March -3rd July 2020**.

What You Will Gain

Undertaking the SeaSeal project is a unique opportunity for you to carry out marine mammal research and contribute to marine conservation. You'll learn about the Atlantic grey seals of Cardigan Bay and gain experience in field work, wildlife photography, photo-ID, data entry, report writing and much more. This role can be a stepping stone to a career in marine research or conservation.

Past volunteers have gone on to further education, work as Marine Mammal Observers and work for other conservation or governmental organisations.

The Volunteering Role

The SeaSeal volunteer will assist with our Living Seas research focused on the Atlantic grey seals of Cardigan Bay. Volunteer responsibilities include (but not limited too) –

- Conducting land based seal surveys (weather dependant)
- Photographing seals and other marine mammals
- Assisting with the annual seal pup survey (During October)
- Conducting photo ID – sorting/matching images
- Analysing data and writing the SeaSeal report
- Providing updates for our website and social media
- Reporting back to the Living Seas Staff
- You will also assist with other areas of our work including land and boat based surveys, running our visitor centre and community engagement activities

Volunteer Skills/Qualities

- Experience with DSLR cameras and wildlife photography
- Previous experience of photo-ID
- ICT skills, including MS Office and GIS
- Experience of data analysis and report writing

Volunteer Dates 2020

We are looking for a SeaSeal volunteer for the period of **23rd March – 3rd July 2020**.

Volunteer Admin Fee

An administration fee of £45 will be required from all successful applicants.

Volunteer Accommodation

Shared accommodation will be arranged for successful volunteers (where required) at a cost of £55 a week, including bills, payable 4 weeks in advance. A refundable £50 deposit is also required and will be returned if the accommodation is left in the same condition it is found in. Please be aware that volunteers will **share same sex bedrooms**. Volunteers are responsible for their own travel, food and accommodation costs.

Please note CBMWC does not own the property. Volunteer accommodation is provided by a local landlord. The accommodation fee is paid directly to the property owner and CBMWC does not receive any payment.

Many volunteers undertake part time, evening work to help cover the accommodation
